

# **BALL FIELD MAINTENANCE RESPONSIBILITIES**

## **CITY OF REDDING- PARKS**

- Skin and level infield prior to March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Spray fence lines and non-turf areas for weed control beginning of each season.
- Set base pegs and replace “standard” bases as necessary.
- Install and remove pitching mounds.
- Repair fences, benches, and bleachers.
- Provide material (decomposed granite/loam) for the use of league maintenance.
- Collect garbage bags from receptacles at K1, K2, K3, Softball Park and Buckeye Park.
- Do all the mowing of the ball fields.
- Maintain and adjust irrigation systems as needed.
- Maintain lighting system.
- Make repairs to backstops and dug outs.
- Make repairs to restroom and concession facilities.
- Renovation of the turf in Fall as necessary

## **CITY OF REDDING- RECREATION**

- Sweep dug outs weekly.
- Clean bleachers once a week.
- Blow surrounding concrete areas once a week.
- Maintain the infield throughout the entire season – dragging the infield, filling in low spots, and packing pitching mound and batters box.
- Prepare the field for game play for the first game of the week.

## **REDDING GIRLS SOFTBALL TEAMS**

- Pick up trash in and around playing facility, including parking lot and dug outs, daily.
- Hose off spills daily.
- Pull weeds along fence line and non-turf areas as they surface.
- Cap base pegs when not in use.
- Prepare field for game play. (Recreation staff will prepare the field for game play for the first game of each week).
- Apply water to infield before dragging, which must be done at the conclusion of each use and before preparing infield for game play. Never drag with bases in place, and never pull drag over home plate or on to turf area. Keep drag at least 1 ½ feet from fence line and backstop.
- Level, wet down and pack pitching mound and batters box after each use.
- Turn off field and building lights; lock dug outs, lock boxes, restroom facilities, storage areas, score boxes, gates, etc. before leaving the facility
- Immediately report vandalism and unsafe conditions to Parks Dept. at 224-6100.
